


## Group 1 – All three forms of the verb are the same

base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
let set hit quit cut shut put hurt cost	let set hit quit cut shut put hurt cost	let set hit quit cut shut put hurt cost	 <p><b>Have you cut</b> your hand?</p> <p><b>I haven't cut</b> my hand.</p> <p><b>I have just cut</b> my finger.</p>

## Group 2 – Two forms of the verb are different

base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
get forget shoot	got forgot shot	got forgot shot	<p><b>Have you got</b> a new car?</p> <p><b>I haven't got</b> a new car.</p> <p><b>I have got</b> a new truck.</p>

### Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group ind – ound

find	found	found	<p><b>Have you found</b> your pencil yesterday?</p> <p><b>I haven't found</b> my pencil.</p> <p><b>I have found</b> my pen.</p>
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### Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group end – ent




send spend	sent spent	sent spent	<p><b>Have you <i>already</i> sent</b> a letter?</p> <p><b>I haven't sent</b> a letter <i>yet</i>.</p> <p><b>I've already sent</b> a postcard.</p>
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### Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group ell – old


base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
sell tell	sold told	sell tell	<p><b>Have you sold</b> your car?</p> <p><b>I haven't sold</b> my car.</p> <p><b>I have sold</b> my boat.</p>




## Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group ee - e

base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
bleed feed meet feel keep sleep	bled fed met felt kept slept	bled fed met felt kept slept	 <p>Have you <b>slept</b> well tonight? I <b>haven't slept</b> sleep well. I <b>have slept</b> badly.</p>

## Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group ea - e

base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
lead read mean leave	led read meant left	led read meant left	 <p>Have you <b>left</b> the class early? I <b>haven't left</b> the class early. I <b>have left</b> the class late.</p>

Group 3 – All **three** forms of the verb are **different**


base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
begin drink ring sing swim	began drank rang sang swam	begun drunk rung sung swum	 <p>Have you <b>ever drunk</b> white tea? I <b>haven't drunk</b> white tea. I <b>have drunk</b> green tea.</p>

## Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group a – oo



base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
take	took	taken	<p>Have you <b>taken</b> aspirin? I <b>haven't taken</b> aspirin. I <b>have taken</b> ibuprofen.</p>

## Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group - o (ō)

base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
break wake speak steal freeze choose	broke woke spoke stole froze chose	broken woken spoken stolen frozen chosen	 <p><b>Have you broken</b> your leg this year?  <b>I haven't broken</b> my leg.  <b>I have broken</b> my arm.</p>

## Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group i (ī) – (ō) – i (ĩ/l)




base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
ride write drive	rode wrote drove	ridden written driven	<p><b>Have you driven</b> a car?  <b>I haven't driven</b> a car.  <b>I have ridden</b> a horse.</p>

## Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group i (ī) – i (ĩ/l) – i (ĩ/l)

bite hide	bit hid	bitten hidden	<p><b>Have you bitten</b> your tongue?  <b>I haven't bitten</b> my tongue.  <b>I have bitten</b> my lip.</p>
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## Irregular Verbs Phonetic Group -aw/ow/y - ew

base form	simple past	participle	question, negative, affirmative
draw blow grow know throw fly	drew blew grew knew threw flew	drawn blown grown known thrown flown	 <p><b>Have you drawn</b> a tree?  <b>I haven't drawn</b> a tree.  <b>I have drawn</b> a flower.</p>
